*A message from our Pastor...*

Dear friends,

We continue this week with part 3 of the Manifesto of Faith by Cardinal Gerhard Miller, Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith 2012-2017.

3. Sacramental Order

The Church is the universal sacrament of salvation in Jesus Christ (CCC 776). She does not reflect herself, but the light of Christ, which shines on her face. But this happens only when the truth revealed in Jesus Christ becomes the point of reference, rather than the views of a majority or the spirit of the times; for Christ Himself has entrusted the fullness of grace and truth to the Catholic Church (CCC 819), and He Himself is present in the sacraments of the Church.

The Church is not a man-made association whose structure its members voted into being at their will. It is of divine origin. "Christ himself is the author of ministry in the Church. He set her up, gave her authority and mission, orientation and goal (CCC 874). The admonition of the Apostle is still valid today, that cursed is anyone who proclaims another gospel, "even if we ourselves were to give it or an angel from heaven" (Gal 1:8). The mediation of faith is inextricably bound up with the human credibility of its messengers, who in some cases have abandoned the people entrusted to them, unsettling them and severely damaging their faith. Here the Word of Scripture describes those who do not listen to the truth and who follow their own wishes, who flatter their ears because they cannot endure sound doctrine (cf. 2 Tim 4:3-4).

The task of the Magisterium of the Church is to "preserve God's people from deviations and defections" in order to "guarantee them the objective possibility of professing the true faith without error" (890). This is especially true with regard to all seven sacraments. The Holy Eucharist is "source and summit of the Christian life" (CCC 1324). The Eucharistic Sacrifice, in which Christ includes us in His Sacrifice of the Cross, is aimed at the most intimate union with Him (CCC 1382). Therefore, the Holy Scripture admonishes with regard to the reception of the Holy Communion: "Whoever eats unworthily of the bread and drinks from the Lord's cup makes himself guilty of profaning the body and of the blood of the Lord" (1 Cor 11:27). "Anyone conscious of a grave sin must receive the sacrament of Reconciliation before coming to communion" (CCC 1385). From the internal logic of the sacrament, it is understood that divorced and civilly remarried persons, whose sacramental marriage exists before God, as well as those Christians who are not in full communion with the Catholic Faith and the Church, just as all those who are not disposed to receive the Holy Eucharist fruitfully (CCC 1457), because it does not bring them to salvation. To point this out corresponds to the spiritual works of mercy.

The confession of sins in Holy Confession at least once a year is one of the Church's commandments (CCC 2042). When the believers no longer confess their sins and no longer experience the absolution of their sins, salvation becomes impossible; after all, Jesus Christ became Man to redeem us from our sins. The power of forgiveness that the Risen Lord has given to the Apostles and their successors in the ministry of bishops and priests applies also for mortal and venial sins which we commit after Baptism. The current popular practice of confession makes it clear that the conscience of the faithful is not sufficiently formed. God's mercy is given to us, that we might fulfil His Commandments to become one with His Holy Will, and not so as to avoid the call to repentance (CCC 1458).

"The priest continues the work of redemption on earth" (CCC 1589). The ordination of the priest "gives him a sacred power" (CCC 1592), which is irreplaceable, because through it Jesus becomes sacramentally present in His saving action. Therefore, priests voluntarily opt for celibacy as "a sign of new life" (CCC 1579). It is about the self-giving in the service of Christ and His coming kingdom

### Lenten Obligations

So that the Church of Metuchen may be spiritually one in a common observance of Lent, the following days of fast and abstinence are to be observed by all Catholics of the Diocese who enjoy the blessings of good health:

1. The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.
3. From the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday until the celebration of the Easter Vigil on the evening of Holy Saturday, the Easter fast should be observed so that, with uplifted and welcoming hearts, we may be ready to celebrate the joys of the Resurrection. This ancient tradition, intimately connected with the Rites of Holy Week and the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, is encouraged, especially in those places baptizing catechumens at the Easter Vigil.

The obligation to fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. To fast in the Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal during the day so as to experience hunger. The obligation of abstinence affects all Catholics who have reached the age of 14. Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat. The obligation of fast and abstinence is a serious obligation. While failure to observe any penitential day in itself may not be considered serious, the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of them without good cause, would be considered a grave matter. Those unable to abstain for a valid reason on any given Friday of Lent are asked to perform some other penitential act, or to abstain on another day.

**Good News from St. James School**



Today is the 8<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. The word Ordinary implies normal, regular, or the usual. It suggests average, consistent, repetitive and maybe even mundane. It is not surprising, that for most of us, that reflects the type of life we live during the course of a year. The Church reflects that same routine and calmness in the Liturgical season called Ordinary Time, when the Church chooses the color green for vestments, banners and cloths. The color green symbolizes new life and hope. This color beautifully reflects nature through its green grass, growing plants, flowers and longer days of light. As you would expect, during the ordinary times in our lives we are provided the opportunity to create a rhythm that forms balance and harmony which results in security, confidence, and stability, all which helps us grow as persons.

This ordinary time cycle will be interrupted for a few months as we begin the Lenten Season on Ash Wednesday. What is it that we are being called to during this new season we are entering? Could it be that we are called to respond in an EXTRA- Ordinary way during Lent? Are we hearing the invitation to reflect, pray, fast, practice works of charity, and ask God to change us so that we are more in sync with Gospel values? Lent is a time for us to be in deeper solitude with Jesus in order to listen to our God. This is a time to be *extraordinary* and intentional in strengthening our relationship with God. In order to create a space within us to hear God speak to us we must turn off the noise.

We must turn off the iPods, TV, radio, cell phones, and all those other little gadgets we have that fill in our extra spaces and prevents us from hearing *silence*. Solitude gives us a chance to regain perspective. It renews us for facing the challenges of life. It allows us to get back into the position of driving our own lives, rather than having them run by schedules and demands from outside. It helps us look at our ordinary lives in a new way and provides us the opportunity to evaluate and make necessary changes. As we move out of the Church cycle of ordinary time and enter into the holy season of Lent with its deep purple liturgical color, penitential theme and ashes on our forehead, let's focus on growing our relationship with God and each other in an extra-ordinary way. I challenge you to take 10 minutes a day, to sit quietly with the Bible, a spiritual reading book, a rosary, or just with your own thoughts and make a connection with God. In doing this you will experience His love and care for you. Even better, do it with your family!
